#### COA Library Resources Curbside Pick Up a Great Resource for Students

Since late spring semester when CoA received its first shipment of Chromebooks the library staff and faculty have been working with the administration to check out computers for student use. At the start of the fall semester CoA's library was the first in the District to roll out curbside distribution of library resources. Library staff are coming in three days a week to provide this service and nearly 100 Chromebooks have been checked out to students so far. The library also is distributing calculators and circulating books. This was a major endeavor and special thanks go to **Cheryl Peel, Caitlin Gilbert, Glenda Gardner, Lili Tavassoli, Ann Buchalter,** and **Jane McKenna** for their good work.

# Free NY Times Online Subscription Is Available Through the CoA Library

Did you know that Peralta students, faculty, and staff are able to access the NY Times online for free as part of a CoA Library subscription? Tired of hitting a paywall when viewing NY Times articles. Not a problem anymore.

By setting up an account using your @peralta.edu email address you get a New York Times online basic subscription + cooking. Your account will give you access to the New York Times website, as well as their mobile app. You do not have to be on campus to access these resources.

#### Here's how you do it:

- 1. In a web browser go to www.NYTimes.com/Pass
- 2. Click on Create Account
- 3. Enter your @peralta.edu email address and create a password.
- 4. New York Times will send you an email verification. Go to that email and click on the link.
- 5. Let them know if you are a Student (and you estimated year of graduation) or Faculty

That's it! Once you have created your login it can also be used in most mobile apps (excluding tablet apps, although you can still access the NYT website on a tablet).

#### **Please Note:**

If you wish to subscribe using the Library for free but you already have an account with the NY Times using your Peralta email, you should change the email address on that subscription and then use your Peralta email to get the Academic Pass.

The Academic Pass is valid for one year. After 364 days you will get a reminder to renew your pass as long as you still have your @peralta.edu email address.
