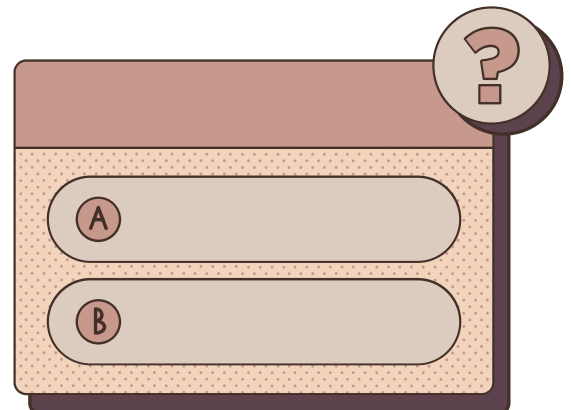

Recap: October Community of Practice



Eleven faculty members joined our October Community of Practice session for robust discussion about regular substantive interaction (RSI). Highlights of our session appear below.

What is RSI?

In summary, every online instructor is required by law ([Chapter 34, §600.2](#)) to meet RSI which stands for:

- **Regular** - instructors communicate with students on a *predictable and scheduled basis*, commensurate with the length of time and the amount of content in the course.
- **Substantive Interaction** - engaging students in teaching, learning, and assessment, consistent with the content under discussion, and also includes *at least two* of the following:
 - Providing direct instruction;
 - Assessing or providing feedback on a student's coursework;
 - Providing information or responding to questions about the content of a course or competency;
 - Facilitating a group discussion regarding the content of a course or competency; or
 - Other instructional activities approved by the institution's or program's accrediting agency.
