President's Corner: CoA Begins Return to Campus

As you are aware, on Friday, September 24, 2021, Chancellor Jackson sent an email to the entire District concerning employees' return to campus. I acknowledge the significant challenges and concerns that these changes, as well as the fear and uncertainty that exist related to COVID-19, may engender. However, please know that we are doing our best to ensure that our students may continue and succeed in their education in a safe and supportive environment.

As we chart these unfamiliar waters, I hope that we can find within us the necessary patience and perseverance needed to navigate the upcoming transition from working at home towards working once again at our welcoming and beautiful campus. As always, thank you for your service to

our students and support of each other. I very much look forward to meeting many of you for the first time in person as we work together to bring our campus back to its former vibrancy. We are all in this together----supporting student learning and success!

Employee Vaccination:

As previously announced, all employees must provide proof of vaccination against COVID-19 by October 7, 2021, as a condition of employment. The Board of Trustees adopted the vaccination policy to make the *The mission of the College of Alameda is to serve the educational needs of its community by providing comprehensive and flexible programs and resources to empower students to achieve their goals.*

inevitable return to in-person instruction and student support as safe as possible for all individuals involved. If you have not done so already, please upload your vaccination information or exemption request via Company Nurse. Exemption forms are available at <u>Safe Peralta</u> and also must be submitted by October 7, 2021. Those not vaccinated will have to submit to weekly COVID-19 testing to ensure that the risk of them being on campus is minimized. Please see <u>Safe Peralta</u> for details regarding testing and other information related to return to campus.

Beginning on October 8, 2021, the vaccination policy will be enforced for employees and, failure to comply with the vaccination policy may be grounds for administrative action. If you are still in need of vaccination, please contact your healthcare provider, use the free Alameda County Public Health Department vaccination service, use your local pharmacy, or sign-up for upcoming clinics at the colleges as posted on Safe Peralta.

Student Vaccination:

Per the announcement from the District, students will be required to upload their proof of vaccination or exemption documents via the Campus Solutions module in PeopleSoft (<u>https://sa.peralta.edu/</u>) Students should have received details on how to upload their proof of vaccination sent out the week of October 4th.

The District recommends students use the state Digital COVID-19 Vaccine Record at https://myvaccinerecord.cdph.ca.gov/ to get a screenshot of their vaccination record for uploading to Campus Solutions.

Please be advised that beginning on October 13, 2021, the vaccination policy will be upheld for students coming to campus and for all students starting Spring 2022. If students still need a vaccination, there are several options available including:

- Students have access to The Roots Clinic via Peralta Health Services
- •. Friday Clinics at Laney College
- •. Alameda County Public Health Department vaccination service
- •. Local pharmacies

Additionally, everyone coming onto District operated property are required to wear masks or other appropriate face coverings. Maintaining a high degree of safety for our students, faculty, and staff remains our chief priority.

ACCESO Kicks Off it's Second Year of Programming with a New Workshop Series and Lively Hispanic Heritage Month Celebrations

College of Alameda's (CoA) Adelante con Comunidad, Excelencia, Sabiduría y Oportunidad (ACCESO) program is now in its second year of operation and going strong. Currently enrolling 180 students, up from 60 last fall, ACCESO is the College's primary project under its \$2.9 million Hispanic Serving Institution Grant (HSI), which was awarded in fall 2019.

Under the leadership of ACCESO/Puente Programs Director **Horacio Corona Lira**, the ACCESO team also has grown this fall with the addition of a part-time counselor, a student success coach, and eight student peer mentors. While ACCESO's mission is to expand opportunities and improve the educational attainment of Latinx students, the program also is open to all CoA students.

This fall ACCESO is offering over 25 workshops led by faculty and staff on various topics designed to support student success, including academic support, transfer, and study strategies. The ACCESO Workshop Series is being widely promoted to all CoA students in order to encourage broad participation.

In addition to the exciting new ACCESO workshop series, Director Corona Lira and Director of Office of Student Activities and Campus Life **Natalie Rodriguez** organized a series of college-wide events in celebration of Latinx/Hispanic Heritage Month.

Latinx/Hispanic Heritage Month program kicked off on September 23, 2021, with a virtual screening of the film Primero, Sueño, followed by a live discussion with Film Director Andres Lira. Over 20 students, faculty, and staff participated in the lively conversation, focusing on the plights of farm workers in California's central valley, and reflecting on their personal experiences related to topics of immigration, poverty, and the need to uplift one another through participating in important cultural engagement opportunities like the events and workshops offered through ACCESO.

CalFresh Application Assistance Events Will Be Held This Month

Although we have unfortunately run out of Emergency Food Grants, students may apply for CalFresh. CalFresh is a financial aid program for food. Students who are enrolled at least half-time, might be eligible for CalFresh if **ONE** of the following apply:

• Participate in EOPS/CARE, SAS (formerly DSPS at CoA), or MESA

• Participate in foster youth programs such as Guardian Scholars, FYSI, NextUp, extended foster care (AB 12/AB 212)

• Have dependent children under the age of 12

- Receive CalWORKs
- Approved for work study
- Work 20 hours/week; or an average of 80 hours/month

Applying online takes just a few minutes and if approved, students will receive money to purchase groceries via an

Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) card every month that they are eligible. Students may apply online at http://www.getcalfresh.org/s/cdss. Please also let students know that CoA is holding CalFresh registration assistance in person events on October 12, 2021, and October 26, 2021.
