Friends, family members, and co-workers of the 21-year-old man established the Daniel Gilbert Memorial Scholarship at CoA in 2008. Mr. Gilbert congratulated this year's award recipients and emphasized the importance of pursuing an education that will provide a livable wage, improve their lives, and benefit the well-being of their community.
