Semester End Reminders

Did you...



Extend the Canvas course end date if needed?

Students will *not* have access to submit assignments in Canvas past the last day of the semester on Friday 12/17 unless you extend the course end date. You must go into your course settings and <u>extend the course end date</u> *before* Saturday12/18; on 12/18, you will not be able to edit course end dates or extend student access without <u>submitting a Help Desk ticket</u>.



Enter zeros in the Canvas gradebook for missing assignments?

Make sure you have zeros '0' entered for missing assignments (where students didn't submit an assignment). If you do not enter a grade in a student's gradebook column, Canvas will ignore the assignment in the final grade calculation. There is a <u>missing</u> <u>submission policy</u> that allows you to automatically assign zeros (if you like) for missing submissions, however this is best enabled at the beginning of the semester. If you enable this setting at the end of the semester or after a submission date passed, you will still need to manually enter a '0' in that column.

campus and our first three courses for review. If approved, College of Alameda will be a fully certified local POCR campus and can award quality reviewed badges on behalf of the California Virtual Campus (CVC). The POCR process is an *optional* professional development opportunity for online faculty, and stipends will be available for participation.

Grading Time-Saving Tips

Looking for ways to maximize efficiency when it comes to grading? Consider the questions below as you **set a comfortable grading workload in your course** and manage realistic time constraints:

- Can time-intensive assignments be replaced with more efficient ones that target learning objectives?
- Is there a way to modify assessments that challenge students without over-burdening you as the instructor? For example, is there content that would lend itself to student-run debates or discussion?
- Can a six page paper be reduced to four pages and still meet learning objectives? It takes less time to read four pages than six, and reinforces the importance of conciseness to students.
- Are there assignments without rubrics? Can current rubrics be improved to streamline grading? Clear rubrics, especially those <u>embedded in Canvas</u>, help students meet expectations and reduce grading.
- Would audio or video feedback be helpful?
- Can you create a library of common grade comments and feedback to copy, paste, and individualize as necessary for students?
