CALIFORNIA PROMISE

The district has signed a contract with HTA Consulting to write the grant proposal and Randy Malat is the principal writer. This consulting group has written both the Career Pathways Trust and Basic Skills Transformation Grants for the district.

The State Chancellor's office is allowing Multicollege districts to submit a district proposal for up to 1.5 million. PCCD will be applying as a District per Chancellor Laguerre, with the framework of strengthening the infrastructure of the Peralta Promise to include the Alameda and Berkeley Promise Projects. What this means is that the Peralta Promise will not just be limited to OUSD, but will expand to include AUSD and BUSD.
