# Respondus LockDown Browser



Peralta discontinued academic integrity software Honorlock last Fall due to student privacy concerns. In response to urgent requests from faculty for a replacement, Respondus LockDown Browser is available for all faculty on a trial basis this Spring as a student and faculty task force evaluate its use.

## What is Respondus LockDown Browser?

Respondus LockDown Browser is a web browser application that prevents students from printing, taking screenshots, using search engines, or accessing applications on their computer during an exam in Canvas. This short 2-minute video provides a brief overview of how it works.

## How is Respondus different from Honorlock and Proctorio?

Respondus LockDown Browser does **not** use student webcams and microphones to make recordings during assessments. There is a separate product that Respondus offers that does use student webcams called Respondus Monitor, but this is **not** the product Peralta is testing or plans to use.

# Respondus LockDown Browser



Implementing new digital tools in the online classroom takes careful advanced planning and preparation. The implementation of Respondus LockDown Browser *after* the semester started may present some challenges to be aware of.

## Distance Education Committee Recommendations

The College of Alameda Distance Education Committee offers the recommendations below as you evaluate the use of Respondus LockDown Browser:

- The tool is only recommended if students were notified proctoring software would be used in the syllabus or other communications at the start of the course.
- Consider concerns around student technology access and equity.
- Provide students with an opportunity to opt in or out of use.
- Faculty should receive training before using new tools prior to the start of the semester where possible.
- Anticipate possible technical issues and try to address them ahead of time:
  - Spend time familiarizing students with how to get ready for and take exams.
  - Make Respondus LockDown Browser training resources accessible to students in advance of the first quiz or exam.
  - Consider offering students a low stakes practice quiz or exam to get used to the software.

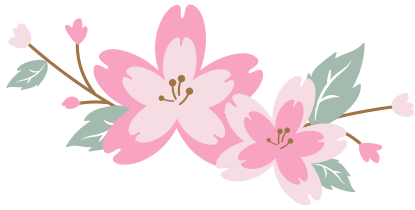
