This will be more controlled than in years past, and there will be conversations with Senators. Park)</li> </ol>	<ul> <li>Summary #3</li> <li>Feedback from statewide AS email list serve received regarding this issue (PFT good standing, committee participation, and the relationship between the two). Most feedback cautioned against PFT membership with committee participation. A. Park shared the email conversation with present AS senators</li> <li>Overall recommendation: navigate with sensitivity</li> <li>A. Park shared a resolution draft</li> </ul>	
4. 2021-2022 class cuts (M. Goldstein)	<ul> <li>Summary #4</li> <li>COA estimates 13-14 FTE cuts, but administrators believe it understates it by 6 FTE. Confirming 100 class cuts for COA campus</li> <li>Heaviest impact on part time faculty</li> <li>Result from enrollment decline across PCCD (i.e. Laney is down 30%), region and country</li> <li>PCCD held harmless until 2024, yet big cuts are projected.</li> <li>Robust discussion held: <ul> <li>Answers are necessary to explain why cuts are discussed. If FTE is taken away and enrollment is the reason why, M. Guzman suggested that faculty can push back by demanding paid time to improve and build classes</li> <li>Advocate for implementing smaller sections</li> </ul> </li> <li>Enrollment management seminar in Summer 2021 planned. M. Goldstein will email the information for faculty senators to attend</li> </ul>	

5. Team teaching (M. Guzman)	<ul> <li><u>Summary #5</u></li> <li>Exploration between disciplines and connecting education</li> <li>Berkeley City College is managing the complications of making it work in accordance with PCCD</li> <li>J.
