
#### Welcome New Members and New Responsibilities

### Fall 2022 Enrollment Update

There is a 22 % increase in student headcount.


There is an increase of 8 % of the residential FTES from Fall to Fall.

There is a significant decrease in the number of low enrolled courses – 29 % less 1-15 courses and 19 % less of courses with 1-19 enrollment.

There is a significant decrease in class cancellations (61 % decrease from year to year).

Interesting also to note that with only 75 % of courses in session, the current FTES is 3 % higher than the entire Fall 2021 FTES.

#### Fall -to- Fall Percentage Change




