In early March 2023, College of Alameda Student Services hosted its Annual High School Partners Breakfast. Over 60 participants representing 29 high schools and pre-college programs across five school districts attended the event. CoA's Annual High School Partners Breakfast brings together school counselors, advisors, and other education professionals who provide direct services to high school students. Morning presentations focused on introducing new partners to the College's various programs and services, including the expansion of CoA's upcoming Summer Bridge program and the introduction of CoA's new SALAAM Learning Community. Partners also met with representatives from the College's various support services, including Equal Opportunity Program and Services (EOPS), Student Accessibility Services (SAS), Puente, Math Engineering Science Achievement (MESA), and Financial Aid among others. Later in the morning, participants heard first-hand testimonials by CoA students. The morning concluded with a campus tour organized by Hispanic Serving Institution Grant Director Horacio Corona-Lira. Thanks to all of the students, faculty, and staff who participated in and helped organize the event, and to Director of Student Life and Activities Natalie Rodriquez for coordinating the student panel. the Annual Partner Breakfast kicks off CoA's signature outreach Mobile CoA program. Mobile CoA helps remove enrollment barriers by bringing application, academic counseling, and registration services to local high schools.

CoA Representatives Present Workshop at Annual AHSIE

College of Alameda's Learning Resource Center Coordinator Johanna Carranza, and Director of Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSI) Grant Horacio Corona Lira, presented a workshop during the 15th Annual Alliance of Hispanic Serving Institution Educators (AHSIE) Best Practices Conference on March 13, 2023, in San Francisco, California. Their workshop titled, "CoA's Puente Summer Bridge: Enhancing the Puente Student Transition to Community College," highlights the implementation of a Puente summer bridge program to enhance student retention, academic success, and sense of community. College of Alameda's Puente Summer Bridge Program is a four-week, non-credit course taught in collaboration with CoA's Learning Resources Center. In this course, students learn about campus resources, student services, how to navigate system tools, like student portal and Canvas, and complete their enrollment in fall semester courses. The Puente Summer Bridge Program was developed as a strategic response, informed by student surveys, student interviews, and data analysis that determined a need for stronger retention and inclusion efforts.

CoA Guided Pathways Team Attends Statewide Conference

California Guided Pathways organized a conference with the theme of California Guided Pathways, from March 22, 2023, to March 24, 2023. President **Dr. Diana Bajrami**, Vice President of Instruction **Maurice Jones**, Vice President of Student Services **Mildred Lewis**, Counseling & Special Programs Dean **Dr. Shalamon Duke**, Classified Senate President **Louie Martirez y McFarland**, LRC Director **Anna O'Neal** and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) Faculty/Co-chair **Didem Ekici** represented College of Alameda at the conference. The three-day conference focused on addressing obstacles to equitable practices in community colleges and developing strategies to promote student success and engagement. The event started with a student panel where students shared their concerns and insights on equity, and it continued with various panels, workshops, and college team strategy sessions that provided opportunities for participants to reflect on the things they learned during the sessions and develop strategies for their institutions for equitable practices.

Workability services include:


