Undocumented Student Resources Homepage

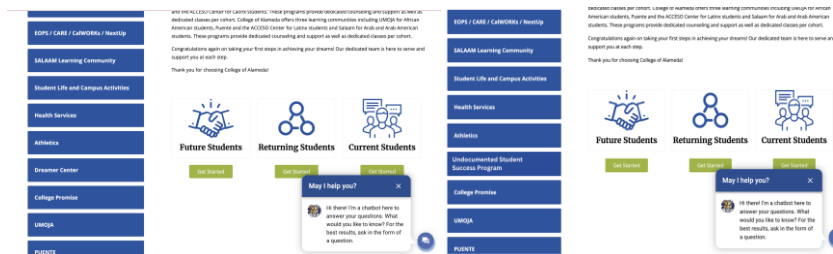
Current Homepage Status:

Here are the following changes I would like to request to be made:

Change #1

- Replace tab title from “Dreamer Center” on the student services page to “Undocumented Student Success Program”



Change #2:

- Have the updated “Undocumented Student Success Program” tab redirect to the overview page link: <https://alameda.edu/students/ab-540-and-california-dream-act/>
- The old link that led to (<https://alameda.edu/students/ab-540-and-california-dream-act/undocumented-students-rights-student-services-cal-dream/>.) can be deleted as similar content will be displayed on another page

Change #3:

- Change the overview page link name from alameda.edu/students/ab-540-and-california-dream-act/ to alameda.edu/COAUSSP, this will now be the official COA Undocu Resource page

Change #4:

- Now that the new updated tab “Undocumented Student Success Program” leads to the official Undocu Resource Page (alameda.edu/COAUSSP), I would like for the homepage picture/banner to be replaced with the following banner image
