### College of Alameda's Career Discovery Day Bridges Gap Between High School and College Success

On April 19, 2024, College of Alameda (CoA) welcomed over 350 high school students from the Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) to its campus for a another transformative Career Discovery Day. This event, organized by CoA's Career Education Division, showcased the college's robust Career Technical Education (CTE) programs alongside special programs, including Extended Opportunities Programs and Services (EOPS), Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (CARE), California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs), Next Up, and SALAAM.

Under the direction of CTE Dean **Dr. Eva Jennings, Emiliano Sanchez**, Coordinator of CTE Trades and Apprenticeships at OUSD, played a pivotal role in rallying students and coordinating logistical details for the event. Special recognition goes to Career Education Coordinator **Donna A. Jones**, who orchestrated Career Discovery Day for CoA, alongside Staff Assistant **Vincent Catacutan**, Senior **Storekeeper Selwyn Montgomery**, **Brandon Lai**, and Associated Student Government President **Natay Myers**. These programs provided vital support for foster youth, first-generation students, student parents, and Equity Programs, with a particular focus on including Southwest Asian and North African (SWANA) students from West and East Oakland.

On a sunny day filled with music, breakfast, and lunch, OUSD students participated in a campus-wide scavenger hunt. This interactive activity not only familiarized them with CoA's departments and buildings but also led them to program information booths, staffed by CoA students. At the EOPS front desk and the welcome center, personalized assistance was offered to students as they explored CoA's majors and programs, bridging the gap between high school and college aspirations.
