The HLTOC program has been offering courses since 1992. The discipline's course retention rate is 88.4%, which is much higher than College of Alameda's. There was a performance gap between ethnicities. White students had a retention rate of 72.5% and Black/African American students had a retention rate of 83.1%. All other ethnicities had a retention rate in the high 80s and 90s.

HLTOC began offering dual enrollment courses in 2016-17 and has continued to expand on these courses.
