





#### ICC REPRESENTATIVES



THE INTER-CLUB COUNCIL (ICC) IS A STANDING COMMITTEE OF THE ASCOA. ICC MEMBERSHIP INCLUDES <u>ONE</u> VOTING REPRESENTATIVE FROM EACH REGISTERED CLUB.

All charted clubs must designate 2 student representatives

Meeting attendance is mandatory

Meetings occur twice a month

## A STUDENT CLUB (OR ORGANIZATION) IS A GROUP OF <u>FIVE</u> OR MORE <u>CUrrently enrolled coa students</u> united by a <u>Common interest or purpose</u>.

MEMBERSHIP MUST BE <u>OPEN TO ALL</u> ELIGIBLE COA STUDENTS.



#### FIVE STEPS TO STARTING A CLUB



#### RECRUIT CLUB MEMBERS

Student clubs should represent the interests of the student body AND promote the social, intellectual, cultural, recreational or spiritual development of students.



New clubs must recruit a

minimum of 5 registered CoA



Club members must be listed in

the <u>Club Member Listing</u> form

#### FIND AN ADVISOR

Every student club is required to have a College of Alameda faculty member or administrator serve as a club advisor.

Some advisor responsibilities include:



Attending club meetings



Supervising club activities



Providing signature approval for expenses

#### SELECT CLUB OFFICERS

Selecting reliable students that meet minimum GPA and enrollment requirements to serve as club officers is critical to preventing delays.

Be registered for a minimum





Have a minimum 2.0

#### WRITE THE CLUB CONSTITUTION

The club's constitution is an important document that describes <u>officer</u> <u>responsibilities, frequency of meetings, the election process and decision making procedures.</u>



SUBMIT REQUIRED FORMS

To complete the club registration process the following documents must

be submitted:

- 1. Club Officer Listing
- 2. Advisor Agreement
- 3. Member Listing Form
- 4. Club Charter Agreement
- 5. Club Constitution



Submit required documents to the office of Student Activities & Campus Life (F-217). INCOMPLETE PACKETS WILL BE RETURNED WITHOUT BEING PROCESSED.



### THE APPROVAL PROCESS

### THERE ARE THREE MAIN STEPS INVOLVED IN THE CLUB APPROVAL PROCESS:

Department staff will conduct registration and GPA checks for executive officers.

Officers that do not meet the minimum GPA and unit requirements will be ineligible.

Different student(s) will need to be identified.

The ASCOA may review a club's constitution up to three times before voting to approve the club charter. The VPO will keep the club informed of its status in the club registration process.

ELIGIBILITY CHECK

CONSTITUTIONAL REVIEW CLUB CHARTER APPROVAL

Completed packets (with officers that meet the minimum GPA and unit requirements) will be forwarded to the ASCOA VPO, the VPO will have the club's constitution placed on the ASCOA meeting agenda for review.

#### NEW CLUB FUNDING

Depending on availability of funding, <u>NEW</u> clubs may receive an allocation of \$100.00 in start-up funds. I approved, funds will be transferred into the club's District account.

Renewing clubs are <u>not eligible</u> for start-up funds.



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


